Member Highlight: Reducing The Stigma -An Embracing Solution

May was Mental Health Awareness Month, which made it the perfect time to celebrate the transformation that our member William Manus has enjoyed. William has been disabled with a mental disorder since he was 21. Still, he was always independent, according to his older sister, Sarah Haston. “He lived alone in our family home for thirteen years after our Mother died,” Sarah shares. “William had no signs of dementia at that time, and he drove and was able to function like anyone else.” Still, William led a lonely life because of the stigma surrounding mental health. He cared nothing about television. He disliked being in crowds of people. Hence, his only socialization was with immediate family members.

eventually asked me to take over paying his bills.”

As William’s confusion increased, Sarah made an appointment for a neurological screening, where it was determined that William was exhibiting early signs of dementia. Soon after, William didn’t make it home from church one morning and was found 150 miles away in Canton, NC. Then, after a bad fall that led to eight days in the hospital and three weeks in rehab, Sarah knew some changes had to be made – starting with William moving in with them. Two years ago, Sarah began to notice changes in her brother. He seemed more confused. His driving became erratic and strange. He would get lost on occasion, and at times he seemed in a fog. “At one point, his bills began to come back,” explains Sarah. “He

When the inevitable caregiver fatigue began to set in, Sarah set out to find a place where William could spend his days. However, there were roadblocks to finding the right place.

Sarah inquired at a local church about their program, but they would not accept him. “Suddenly I had an overwhelming feeling of rejection of my brother,” she shares. “I almost didn’t contact The Ivey for that same fear of rejection. But I’m glad I did.” The Ivey welcomed him with open arms. Sarah wanted most for her brother to be treated with respect, understanding and kindness. “We have been blessed with all of this and more,” she declares.

After an initial apprehension about attending and being away from his sister, he blossomed. Sarah says, “He is talking like I haven’t seen him talk in years. He loves The Ivey and looks forward to going every day, and when I pick him up, he is excited to tell me about all the activities he engaged in that day. In fact, he thanks me often for finding this place for him.”

Interaction with fellow members boosts his self-esteem and gives purpose to his day. He looks forward to the daily exercise, loves to play chess, and The Ivey staff accommodates his preferences gladly. Breakfasts and lunches are highlights in his day. And on days when our musical entertainer, John Lewis, performs, he even dances – “something he loved doing as a teenager,” Sarah says with a smile.

Helping To Create a “Dementia Friendly” Charlotte

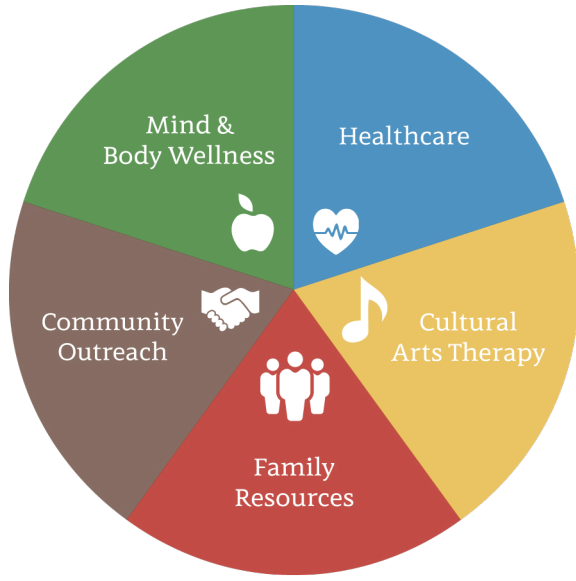
Recently, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services partnered with Charlotte leaders in hosting an event on May 2nd to discuss the impact of dementia on our city and its residents. Entitled “Developing a Dementia-Capable Charlotte Mecklenburg,” the event was attended by over 75 community leaders, including leaders of The Ivey.

The Charlotte gathering was an important step in North Carolina’s participation toward creating a “Dementia Friendly America.” This national initiative (www.dfamerica.org) brings together the work of over 35 national organizations representing all community sectors – collectively leveraging their national reach to activate local affiliates to convene, participate in and support dementia-friendly community efforts at the local level. The Ivey is proud to advocate, locally, for these efforts, alongside organizations such as faith communities, emergency planning and first response, legal and advanced planning services, government services, the Alzheimer’s Association, Centralina Area Agency on Aging, the business community, and more.

As awareness of dementia grows, we all can and should take action to make our communities more dementia friendly. In fact, every segment of the community can play a unique role in providing meaningful support to people with dementia, their families, and their care partners.
